## B. Maintenance Report

**Maintenance Report** 

Last Friday was our annual Senior Pride Day, a day where the seniors have many activities, including community service projects. There were a number of small projects accomplished by the Class of 2024, and I want to publicly acknowledge their efforts as a class. You will notice a number of freshly painted areas and beautification projects

completed. We thank our students for doing a great job in taking pride in the school.

As we move toward the selling of bonds, we have some movement on two of our bond projects. As I told you last month, Chriss Jobe has been working on the RFP for the HS paving projects. I met with him regarding the drainage and work in the North lot behind the gym. We hope to put that RFP out in early October. Also tonight, we now have the schedule for the RFP and pre-bid meeting activities surrounding the middle school flat roof project. I put that information in your board packet for tonight. I will remind you that VPS out of Evansville is the firm handling the design under the supervision of Scott Stenftenagel. They will also be getting us the information relevant to the elementary shingle roof in time for the October meeting. It is my goal to have all three RFP's out in October with the bids being collected prior to the November closing date of the bond sale.

As a reminder, the pre-bid meeting for the MS roof project will be Thursday, September 28, 2023 at the middle school at 9:30AM. The bids are due at 1PM on October 12th. The bids will be open and read publicly.

The remaining project piece is with the Gym HVAC system. Mr. Decker and I have been trying to get clarification over the last month from the Indiana State Board of Accounts regarding the Job Order Contract possibilities. We are running into a couple of road blocks involved with this portion of the project. People keep telling us that schools aren't eligible for JOC jobs, but no one can cite any law or documentation saying so. We will continue working on this portion. If we can't get JOC Agreement, my recommendation will be to turn this job into a design build and utilize Mr. Decker's expertise as we move forward. This will be a job that is slated for completion in the Summer of 2024.

In other activity regarding the bond, Mrs. Enochs and I have our meeting with the Bond Rating Company. As you'll remember in the last round of bond sales, we received an A+rating. We hope to be able to match that rating this time around. We will have that meeting tomorrow morning.

#### C. Social Media Lawsuit

**Social Media Lawsuit** 

Last month, I included information in your packets regarding the upcoming class action lawsuit being directed at the social media industry. This action is similar to the JUUL lawsuit that we entered and won last year. The suit centers on the problems created by social media for schools and students and includes the targeted advertisements that are used within.

I gave the Board a month to look over the materials and give merit to joining the nationwide lawsuit. There have been a number of Indiana schools join already, including two of our surrounding neighbors. In all transparency, this problem is just as big for us, if

not bigger, than the JUUL situation.

What is the Board's interest level? It would take Board approval for me to sign WRVSD up in support of this proposal; there is no cost involved to us.

Mr. Conner Hill made a motion to move forward with the social media lawsuit.

The motion was seconded by Mr. Andy Davis. The motion passed 7-0.

#### VIII. New Business

# A. Adopt 2024 Budget

Adopt 2024 Budget

This moves us to the next agenda item. Tonight, I am asking the Board to adopt our 2024 budget. The 2024 budget will be used on an assessed valuation of \$290,000,000. Our advertised tax rate will be \$1.6373. For comparative purposes, the 2023 budget was advertised at an assessed valuation of \$260,000,00 and a tax rate of \$1.78. Remember, we always advertise high and then the Division of Local Government Finance will review our budget funds. By law, we can cut our advertised rates, but we cannot raise the rates after a budget submission. The 2023 budget numbers ended up being a tax rate of \$.94 from an assessed valuation of just over \$338,000,000. The 2024 budget dept services will be .33. I need the Board to adopt the 2024 budget. By law, the budget CPF and Bus Replacement Plans had to be submitted and published by the state website called Gateway. We also had to post both on our district website ten days prior to the budget hearing, which was September 5th. We held a public hearing on the 2024 budget, the CPF plan, and the 2024 bus replacement plan on September 5th. I would like to recommend the passage of the 2024 budget. This will take a motion.

Mrs. Cleta Shake made a motion to approve the passage of the 2024 budget.

The motion was seconded by Mr. Conner Hill. The motion passed 7-0.

Thank you. Along with adopting the budget, there are a number of resolutions that must be passed in order for us to maneuver within that budget.

\*2024 Budget Transfer Resolution

(This allows us to transfer money within funds and between funds.)

\*Fall/Spring Budget Hearing Resolution

(This allows us to be able to make changes, adjustments, or reductions to any of the 17 lines of Form 4B.)

\*2024 Bus Replacement Plan Adoption Resolution

(This resolution states that we have an adopted Bus Replacement that was given a proper hearing and will be submitted along with the 2024 budget.)

\*Rainy Day Fund Transfer Resolution

(This will allow us to transfer up to \$200,000 from any of the funds other than the Education Fund at the end of budget year 2023 to move into the Rainy Day fund at the end of 2024.

\*2024 Capital Projects Plan Adoption Resolution

(This resolution states that we have an adopted Capital Projects Plan that was given a proper hearing and will be submitted along with the 2024 budget.)

- \* We must also pass the following resolution due to 1009:
- \*\*Resolution to Transfer Amounts from the Education to the Operations Fund on a monthly basis up to \$74,734 (State payments will come solely to the Education Fund and this resolution allows us to transfer to the Operations Fund on a monthly basis.
- \*The 2024 Temporary Interest Resolution

(This resolution lets us utilize temporary interest as a resource in case we need to pick up tax anticipation warrants, which we did when there was uncertainty in 2020.)

These resolutions need Board action to be adopted. You may do them all at once or individually.

Mr. Joe Decker made a motion to adopt all of the presented resolutions.

The motion was seconded by Mr. Andy Davis. The motion passed 7-0.

We must now take some time to publicly sign all of these resolutions along with Indiana Budget Form 4. Form 4 is the advertised budget notification form that is filed with the DLGF through the Gateway system within the next five days.

B. Permission to Advertise Snow Removal Quotes for 203-24

It is getting to be that time of year again. Tonight, I am asking the Board to grant me permission to advertise specifics for our snow removal needs for the 2023-24 winter months.
